What is the Ocean Decade?

Launched in January 2021, the United Nations Decade of Ocean Science for Sustainable Development (2021-2030), the 'Ocean Decade', is a 'once in a lifetime' opportunity for ocean actors across the world to come together to generate knowledge and foster the partnerships needed to support a well-functioning, productive, resilient, sustainable and inspiring ocean.

The Intergovernmental Oceanographic Commission (IOC) of UNESCO is responsible for coordinating the work of the Ocean Decade.

MISSION:

“Transformative ocean science solutions for sustainable development, connecting people and our ocean.”

What will guide the Ocean Decade?

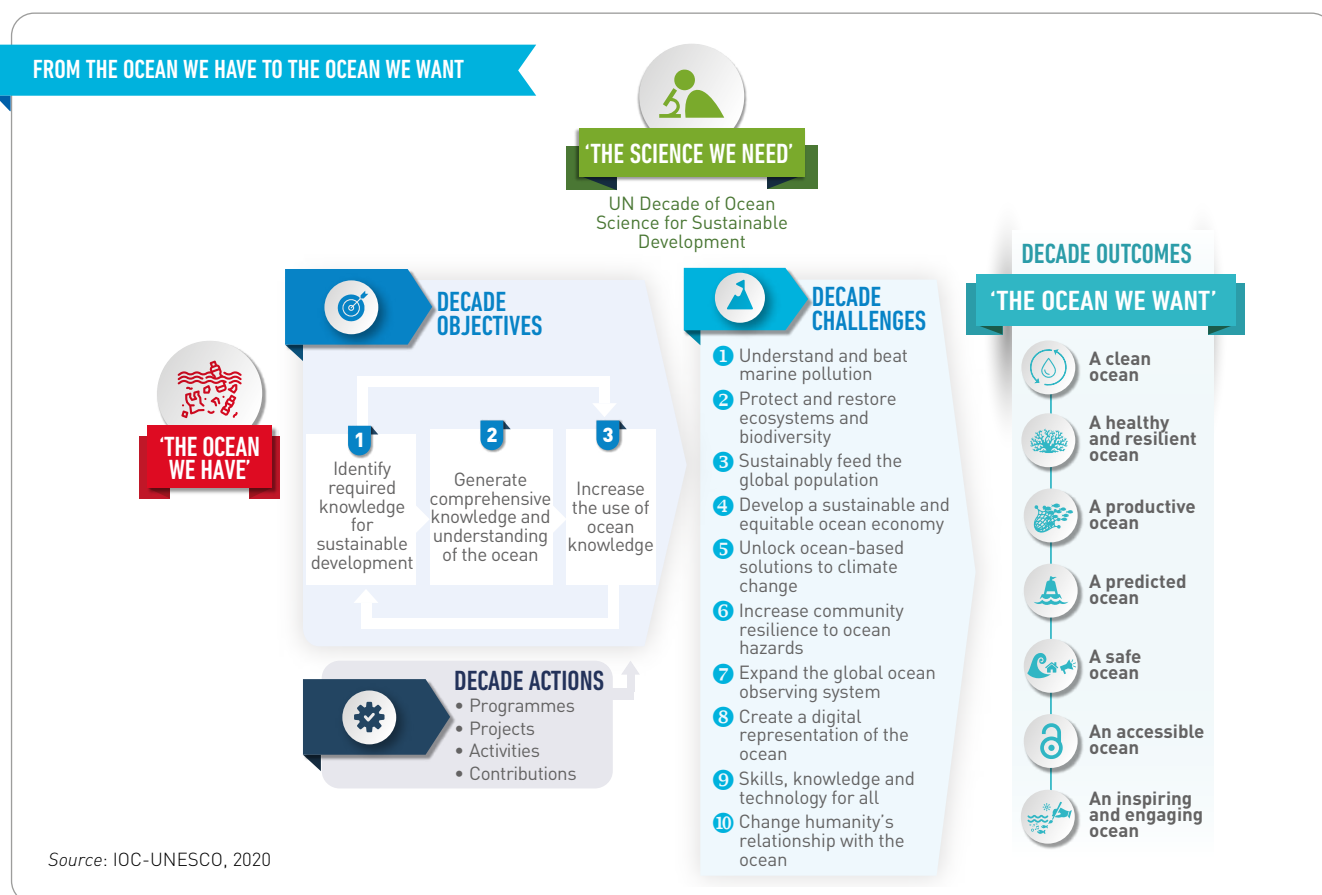
The work of the Ocean Decade will be guided by the **Implementation Plan**. This is the living roadmap we will follow to achieve the Ocean Decade's vision.

DECADE OUTCOMES describe the 'ocean we want' at the end of the Ocean Decade. Achieving these Outcomes will contribute to the 2030 Agenda for Sustainable Development and relevant global and regional policy frameworks.

DECADE CHALLENGES are the most immediate and pressing needs of the Decade. Each of the ten Challenges contributes to one or more Decade Outcomes and may evolve with new challenges added over the next ten years.

DECADE OBJECTIVES are relevant to all the Challenges and provide a roadmap we will follow to progress from the 'ocean we have to the ocean we want'.

DECADE ACTIONS are tangible initiatives and endeavours that will be identified, implemented and supported by a wide range of partners over the next ten years.

How will the Ocean Decade achieve the 'ocean we want'?

A wide range of **Decade Actions** identified, implemented and supported by diverse partners and stakeholders across the world will be carried out over the next ten years to meet and deliver on the ten Decade Challenges.

Decade Actions can take the following forms:

PROGRAMMES

- ▶ large scale, multi-year and typically multi-country initiatives made up of different projects, activities and contributions
- ▶ initiatives implemented on a global or regional scale, typically interdisciplinary in nature and contribute to one or more Challenges

PROJECTS

- ▶ shorter more focused initiatives that typically, but not always, form part of a Programme endorsed by the Decade

Programmes and **Projects** will be identified via *Calls for Decade Actions* held several times a year and announced on the [Ocean Decade website](#).

ACTIVITIES

- ▶ typically one-off standalone initiatives (e.g., event, publication, exhibition, workshop, conference or training opportunity) that contributes to a Programme or Project or to one or more of the Challenges or Outcomes. CONTRIBUTIONS

- ▶ in-kind or financial resources which support a Decade Action or the coordination functions of the Decade. Contributions may be submitted by contacting oceandecade@unesco.org.

Who's who in the Ocean Decade?

The **IOC Secretariat** coordinates a wide variety of programmes in areas like ocean observations, tsunami warnings and marine spatial planning. The Secretariat supports Member States by helping build their scientific and institutional capacity, so they are able to meet their commitments to SDG14. The Secretariat has been mandated by the United Nations General Assembly to coordinate the overall work of the Ocean Decade.

The **Decade Coordination Unit**, located in the IOC Secretariat, is the central hub that manages the day-to-day operation and implementation of the Ocean Decade.

A **Decade Advisory Board** is currently being established to provide strategic technical advice on implementation of the Ocean Decade. Nominations for membership will open during the second half of 2021.

Decade Coordination Offices and Decade Collaborative Centres – located in different parts of the world and hosted by other UN agencies or governments, international and regional organizations or other partners – will support the work of the Ocean Decade and help coordinate efforts between national, regional and global initiatives, share knowledge and tools developed, create links between potential Decade partners and monitor and report on the impact of the Decade.

Decade Implementing Partners are non-UN regional or international stakeholder organizations that sit outside formal governance and coordination structures of the Ocean Decade but provide targeted support to the Decade Coordination Unit and decentralized coordination structures – including Decade Coordination Offices and Decade Collaborative Centres.

National Decade Committees are informal voluntary multi-agency or multi-stakeholder national entities which sit outside the formal governance and coordination structures of the Ocean Decade. National Decade Committees will support decentralized coordination structures by catalysing and helping coordinate Decade Actions at the national level.

Regional Taskforces and Working Groups will convene and engage Ocean Decade stakeholders at the regional level, identify regional and thematic scientific priorities, as well as capacity development needs, while ensuring alignment with ongoing and planned regional initiatives.

The **Ocean Decade Alliance** is a high-level group of eminent partners which aim to catalyze large-scale resource commitments towards the Decade through networking, resource mobilization and influence.

What mechanisms will facilitate engagement between Ocean Decade stakeholders?

The Ocean Decade is in the midst of rolling out the following voluntary stakeholder engagement networks to facilitate, stimulate and foster exchanges between stakeholder groups with similar interests throughout the Decade.

Global Stakeholder Forum (coming in 2021!)

- ▶ The Forum will be the key engagement mechanism for established members and stakeholder networks of the Decade.
- ▶ The Forum will have virtual and physical elements which convene different communities of practice around the ten Decade Challenges.
- ▶ Stakeholders of the Forum will be able to come together to create new ideas, knowledge-based solutions and partnerships that contribute to an equitable and sustainable ocean economy.
- ▶ Funding and partnership opportunities, training events, meetings, conferences and requests for inputs to the Decade will be broadcast via the Forum.

Generation Ocean (coming in 2021!)





- ▶ GenO is a communications campaign to inspire, rally and mobilize any individual across all generations, genders and geographies to protect and restore the ocean.
- ▶ GenO is anchored in scientific research and calls on the public to take everyday actions that make a difference for the health and well-being of people and the ocean.
