BACKGROUND

- Traditional Public-Private Partnerships focus on financing
 - Road construction where a private partner assumes risk of cost overruns in exchange for the revenue stream from tolls
- We are building our report around non-monetary models
 - Monetary P3 models are already well-developed
- We identified six types of non-monetary P3 applications available to NOAA

NON-MONETARY P3 MODELS

- Shared technology development
- Transition of technologies NOAA develops into routine application
- Clarifying NOAA's role, empowering private investors to fill available niches
- Collaborative data collection
- Engagement in public decision processes
- Workforce development

PRODUCTS WE WILL PRODUCE

- 10-15 page report describing range of P3 mechanisms available to NOAA
 - Single-page executive summary of findings and recommendations
 - Body of report will include a section for each mechanism
- For each mechanism we will cover four topics:
 - Description of how NOAA is presently employing that mechanism
 - Opportunities for expanding within each mechanism
 - Potential pitfalls within each type that NOAA should seek to avoid
 - Constraints to implementation that NOAA needs to overcome
- We will also produce an accompanying PowerPoint presentation

PROCESS

- We are starting with the first three mechanisms
 - Not enough people to do all of them at once
 - Start with the mechanisms people felt had the most opportunity for suggestions
- Divide and conquer
 - Created a three-person subcommittee for each mechanism
- Interviewing people who have had experience with each mechanism
 - Including staff within NOAA

TIMING

- The subcommittees will work separately for another two months
- Reassemble as a large group to vet and integrate the individual findings in October
- Verbal presentation of draft findings/recommendations for SAB feedback at our November meeting
- Draft written report for SAB consideration at our spring meeting
